a. Know and apply grade-level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words. (CCSS: RF.3.3)	yes	All 36 weekly units offers explicit, direct instruction on 3 rd grade, single and multisyllabic decoding and skill analysis.
Identify and know the meaning of the most common prefixes and derivational suffixes. (CCSS: RF.3.3a)	yes	The most common prefixes and affixes are taught. A total of 13 prefixes and 18 suffixes are including in the weekly morphology units.
Decode words with common Latin suffixes. (CCSS: RF.3.3b)	yes	12 Latin roots are included as well as the following Latin suffixes: <able>, <ible>, <ment>, <ly>, <y>, and <ology>
Decode multisyllable words. (CCSS: RF.3.3c)	yes	The program's main objective is decoding and encoding multisyllabic words. Multiple syllable words are taught in all 36 units.
Read grade-appropriate irregularly spelled words. (CCSS: RF.3.3d)	yes	A list of 3 rd grade-appropriate irregular words is included. Two-three irregular words are taught each week.

b. Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension. (CCSS: RF.3.4)	yes	Each weekly unit focuses on accuracy and fluency at the sound, word, phrase, and passage level.
i. Read grade-level text with purpose and understanding. (CCSS.3.4a)	yes	Weekly skill-based passages are available on grade-level and contribute to knowledge building and language understanding.
ii. Read grade-level prose and poetry orally with accuracy, appropriate rate, and expression. (CCSS.3.4b)	yes	Fluency is a pillar of the program. Accuracy, rate, and expression are all explicitly taught with adequate student practice.
c. Determine or clarify the meaning of unknown and multiple-meaning word and phrases based on grade 3 reading and content, choosing flexibly from a range of strategies. (CCSS: L.3.4)	yes	
i. Determine the meaning of the new word formed when a known affix is added to a known word (e.g., <i>agreeable/disagreeable, comfortable/uncomfortable, care/careless, heat/preheat</i>). (CCSS: L.3.4b)	yes	The embedded morphology program gives students ample opportunity to determine a words new meaning when a known affix is added. This is both modeled and practiced.
iv. Use a known root word as a clue to the meaning of an unknown word with the same root (e.g., <i>company, companion</i>). (CCSS: L.3.4c)	yes

e. Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English grammar and usage when writing or speaking. (CCSS: L.3.1)	yes	Grammar is closely tied to morphology as adding affixes often changes a word's part of speech. This is addressed in the following weekly units: 1, 2, 3, 5, 10, 11, 15, 16, 17, 20, 21, 22, 26, 29, &35
viii. Form and use comparative and superlative adjectives and adverbs, and choose between them depending on what is to be modified. (CCSS: L.3.1g)	yes	This concept is introduced in unit 15; morphology topic: suffix<er> as a comparative adjective, and again, in unit 22 with suffixes <er> and <est>
f. Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English capitalization, punctuation, and spelling when writing. (CCSS: L.3.2)	yes	All 36 units of this program offer direct, explicit instruction of encoding or spelling standard English.
v. Use conventional spelling for high-frequency and other studied words and for adding suffixes to base words (e.g., <i>sitting, smiled, cries, happiness</i>). (CCSS: L.3.2e)	yes	All 36 units of this program address conventional spelling for high-frequency, patterned, and irregular words. Units 11,20, &21 address spelling changes when adding suffixes to base words.
vi. Use spelling patterns and generalizations (e.g., <i>word families, position-based spellings, syllable patterns, ending rules, meaningful word parts</i>) in writing words. (CCSS: L.3.2f)	yes	Spelling patterns and generalizations for 36 patterns are taught in the program. Position-based spelling and all syllable types are included. The embedded morphology program addresses meaningful word parts and ending rules.
